Dr. Duke Pesta to discuss "C.S. Lewis and Faith in a Faithless World" on Jan. 18

Dr. Pesta is a professor of English at the University of Wisconsin in Oshkosh. He was raised in Catholic schools, and also taught for some time in a Catholic High School. He received his M.A. in Renaissance literature from John Carroll University, and his Ph.D. in Shakespeare and Renaissance literature from Purdue University. He has taught courses on Shakespeare, Renaissance literature, the Bible, Russian literature, Christian Apologetics, and C.S. Lewis.

Dr. Pesta has pointed out on occasion that he is the only English literature professor at UW-Oshkosh who teaches "Shakespeare and C. S. Lewis." According to a 4-13-14 article in the *Milwaukee Journal Sentinel*, "Pesta is engaging and popular; his students at UW-Oshkosh say you can give him the opening line of any section of a Shakespeare play and he can recite the next 10 lines." The article also quotes a student from Stoughton who insists that Dr. Pesta is "easily in the top five professors I've had, and I've been here [UW-Oshkosh] five years...I think the way he teaches is quite brilliant."

Although most Catholics are familiar with the prayer to "St. Michael the Archangel," many may not realize that the prayer was composed in 1898 by Pope Leo XIII. The introduction to the original, long version of the prayer, on page 3, explains how this came about in the life of Pope Leo. The well-known "short version" is also on page 3, following the original, long version. The Pope eventually ordered the short version of the "Prayer to St. Michael the Archangel" to be recited daily, after Low Mass, in all the churches throughout the Catholic world. However, this practice was almost completely swept away in the 1960s by liturgical changes made in the wake of Vatican Council II. Looking at the very anti-Christian culture of death, in which we live, it would certainly be appropriate to encourage our pastors, and bishops, to reinstate this practice of saying the short version of the "Prayer to St. Michael the Archangel" after every Mass.

Interesting testimony against high school "gay/straight" outreach programs

In the December, 2014 Newsletter, we were critical of an announcement that three more Catholic parishes were offering a parish based "Gay and Straight in Christ," GLBT outreach program. Interestingly, on page 133 of *Breaking Through* (2012), edited by Helen Alvare, a teenager who was suffering from Same-Sex-Attraction and decided to reject those feelings, stated that this decision was strengthened by, "...the development of new friendships that prompted me to be more outgoing, and the fact that there were no gay activist student groups in my high school allowed me to be free from SSA by the age of eighteen." (Emphasis added) Again, confirming young people in their "perceived" SSA is wrong, and can be very harmful.

Answer: Temperance is the moral virtue by which we moderate our desire for pleasurable goods. Temperance helps us control our enjoyment of sensual pleasures. A temperate person moderates the sexual drive, and does not eat or drink too much. Bill Donohue, in Why Catholicism Matters explains that "abstinence, chastity, and modesty are known as the three subordinate virtues of temperance." He adds that, without temperance, "individuals self-destruct, and so may society." p.220

Book of the Month: "Abandoned"



"Original Prayer to St Michael the Archangel"

by Pope Leo XIII

Roman Raccolta, July 23, 1898, supplement approved July 31, 1902

One day, after celebrating Mass, the aged Pope Leo XIII was in conference with the Cardinals when suddenly he sank to the floor in a deep swoon. Physicians who hasted to his side could find no trace of his pulse and feared that he had expired. However, after a short interval the Holy Father regained consciousness and exclaimed with great emotion: "Oh, what a horrible picture I have been permitted to see!" He had been shown a vision of evil spirits who had been released from Hell and their efforts to destroy the Church. But in the midst of the horror the archangel St. Michael appeared and cast Satan and his legions into the abyss of hell. Soon afterwards Pope Leo XIII composed the following prayer to St. Michael, which is the original version:

"O Glorious Prince of the heavenly host, St. Michael the Archangel, defend us in the battle and in the terrible warfare that we are waging against the principalities and powers, against the rulers of this world of darkness, against the evil spirits. Come to the aid of man, whom Almighty God created immortal, made in His own image and likeness, and redeemed at a great price from the tyranny of Satan.

"Fight this day the battle of the Lord, together with the holy angels, as already thou hast fought the leader of the proud angels, Lucifer, and his apostate host, who were powerless to resist thee, nor was there place for them any longer in Heaven. That cruel, ancient serpent, who is called the devil or Satan who seduces the whole world, was cast into the abyss with his angels. Behold, this primeval enemy and slayer of men has taken courage. Transformed into an angel

of light, he wanders about with all the multitude of wicked spirits, invading the earth in order to blot out the name of God and of His Christ, to seize upon, slay and cast into eternal perdition souls destined for the crown of eternal glory. This wicked dragon pours out, as a most impure flood the venom of his malice on men of deprayed mind and corrupt heart, the spirit of lying, of impiety, of blasphemy, and the pestilent breath of im-

purity, and of every vice and iniquity.

"These most crafty enemies have filled and inebriated with gall and bitterness the Church, the spouse of the immaculate Lamb, and have laid impious hands on her most sacred possessions. In the Holy Place itself, where the See of Holy Peter and the Chair of Truth has been set up as the light of the world, they have raised the throne of their abominable impiety, with the iniquitous design that when the Pastor has been struck, the sheep may be.

"Arise then, O invincible Prince, bring help against the attacks of the lost spirits to the people of God, and give them the victory. They venerate thee as their protector and patron; in thee holy Church glories as her defense against the malicious power of hell; to thee has God entrusted the souls of men to be established in heavenly beatitude. Oh, pray to the God of peace that He may put Satan under our feet, so far conquered that he may no longer be able to hold men in captivity and harm the Church. Offer our prayers in the sight of the Most High, so that they may quickly find mercy in the sight of the Lord; and vanquishing the dragon, the ancient serpent, who is the devil and Satan do thou again make him captive in the abyss, that he may no longer seduce the nations. Amen.

V. Behold the Cross of the Lord; be scattered ye hostile powers.

R. The Lion of the tribe of Judah has conquered the root of David.

V. Let Thy mercies be upon us, O Lord.

R. As we have hoped in Thee.

V. O Lord, hear my prayer.

R. And let my cry come unto Thee.

Let us pray.

O God, the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, we call upon Thy holy Name, and as supplicants, we implore Thy clemency, that by the intercession of Mary, ever Virgin Immaculate and our Mother, and of the glorious St. Michael the Archangel, Thou wouldst deign to help us against Satan and all the other unclean spirits who wander about the world for the injury of the human race and the ruin of souls. Amen"

SHORT PRAYER TO ST. MICHAEL: St. Michael the Archangel, defend us in battle, be our protection against the malice and snares of the devil. May God rebuke him we humbly pray; and do thou, O Prince of the Heavenly host, by the power of God, thrust into hell Satan and all evil spirits who wander through the world for the ruin of souls. Amen.
